


even learn new vocabulary words! VFW members and anyone invited by a VFW member may play. There is no cost other than your green fees at the course.

Excerpt from KARE11 news article: [Technical Sgt. Halvorson joined the Arm in 1943. At the age of 20, he was assigned to the 34th Infantry Division Red Bull unit and led a platoon of soldiers from Naples Italy to the border of Switzerland.

The Minnesota National Guard said Halvorson "led his team of machine gun and mortar squadron as they fought for three years through costly, lengthy, but ultimately successful battles."

Halvorson was also present when the German forces surrendered to the American 34th Infantry Division on May 1, 1945.





For his service, Halvorson was awarded the Bronze Star, the Distinguished Unit Badge, and the Combat Infantryman's Badge.

On Monday, February 24, he received another award: The Medal of Saint George Bronze Medallion to honor Halvorson's "outstanding leadership, technical and tactical competence, and exceptional teamwork."

Halvorson was presented with this high honor during a ceremony held on his 102nd birthday.

A kind gesture that proves even after more than a century, life is still full of surprises.]
